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Washington Update

Elections -

Looks like divided government -

- White House Biden; some challenges and recounts
- House Majority stays with D's, but R's pick-up seats
- Senate 50R; 48D; 2 Special Elections in GA 1/5/21

Senate in session this week; both House & Senate next week

• Stopgap Government Funding Bill expires 12/11/20; Primary vehicle for legislative action

COVID Pandemic Relief

Last offer from WH to Pelosi pre-election was max of \$1.9T

- Included:
 - \$400/week additional UI
 - \$250B state & local governments
 - Relief for airlines
 - PPP
 - etc.
- House passed \$2.2T bill in late October after no deal
- Negotiations to continue; McConnell to be more involved
- Bipartisan support to do something; likely less than \$1.9T

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Medicare Competitive Bidding

CMS not awarding contracts for 13 bid items because payment amounts "did not achieve expected savings."


• Current gap rates will remain in effect, plus CPI 1/1/21.

DME Proposed Payment Rule CMS-1738-P <u>effective 4/1/21</u> <u>or end of PHE, whichever is longer.</u>

- Non-Bid Rural rates will return to 50/50 blend
- Non-Bid non rural rates will go back to 100% of adjusted fee schedule
- CRT manual exemption & temp payment relief codified
- HCPCS Coding & BCD process changes to increase transparency

We Follow Medicare They Say



Many Medicare Beneficiaries are being enticed by **celebrities** on TV to select a Medicare Advantage (MA) plan over Original Medicare Fee for Service (FSS) with claims that they provide all the same benefits of Medicare with a lower out of pocket cost.

- These plans often state they provide <u>additional benefits</u> such as gym memberships, transportation and eyeglasses, meals, etc.
- How can they provide more benefits at a lower cost?

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We Follow Medicare They Say

How can these **private for-profit insurance companies** provide more for less while paying all these celebrities to promote their insurance on TV and make a profit?

- Some of these plans are able to do this with the increased number of members thus spreading the costs over a larger pool
- Others, from what suppliers are experiencing, are able to do this by NOT actually providing the same benefits as Original Medicare or making suppliers jump over hurdles to receive reimbursement

We Follow Medicare They Say

When suppliers encounter a customer that has a **Medicare Advantage Plan** they must determine if they have to be in network if required and the coverage policies.

- Many plans inform their customers as well as the suppliers that they "Follow Medicare Guidelines".
- Most would take this that they will cover and process claims the same as Original Medicare
- While these plans ARE required at a minimum to furnish ALL medically necessary Medicare covered DME (policy) they are NOT required to follow Medicare's payment rules (prices, rental / purchase, modifiers, clean claim timeliness, etc.)

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We Follow Medicare They Say

CMS-

"While MA plans are required to furnish all medically necessary Medicare covered DME they are NOT required to follow Original Medicare payment rules in furnishing those services".

- Paying complex rehab power wheelchairs on rental basis (not allowing the bene purchase option)
- Not paying the same rate (fee schedule)
- Not implementing the Medicare Policy per policy (not paying electronics for power functions, etc.)
- Delaying payment (not required to the Original Medicare "clean claim" 30-day rule)
- Denying claims and leading suppliers in the appeal labyrinth

We Follow Medicare They Say


What can you do?


- First review all contracts thoroughly and make sure it's clear (in writing) what they pay, how much they pay and how they pay (rental / purchase).
- Don't just accept "We Follow Medicare Guidelines" because that doesn't mean they follow Medicare's payment rules since they are not required to per CMS. Get it in writing!
- If you can't accept what they offer, don't! Try to <u>negotiate a</u> <u>fair contract</u> and if they won't, don't accept it.

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
We Follow Medicare They Say

- Educate MA plan customers of the pros and cons of MA compared to Original Medical
- Remember they are only hearing from celebrities promoting their plans of how great they are but not how they may negatively impact their true medically necessary benefits
- If the beneficiary would like to change back to Original Medicare, they can do so by February 14, 2021 for any reason.
- If after February 14, 2021 the beneficiary has an issue with obtaining medically necessary equipment due to their current insurance plan's policies and payment rules, they would need to file a complaint with Original Medicare and they can assist them in changing back to original (traditional) Medicare.










What Is Appreciative Inquiry?

- An approach to organizational management that emphasizes working from strengths to find new directions for growth rather than focusing on weaknesses or issues to be solved
- Leads to strategic change and sustainable growth for organizations
- Strengths-based

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Using Appreciative Inquiry works because it:

- Accelerates change
- Increases the rate of improvement and the speed of attainment of goals and results
- Creates motivation and energy
- Improves communication and trust
- Changes the basic orientation from problem-focused to possibility-focused
- Increases curiosity and sense of vitality
- Empowers and gives people the confidence to take risks

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Reframing During Covid-19

Generative questions to shift the tone/direction of dialogue toward value-added outcomes:

- What are the strategies to sustain social connections within a context of physical distancing?
- What does tele-work look like when we are at our best?
- How do we re-invent ourselves within a changing economic context?

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Assistive Technology Act

 - Incorporate consumer control and consumer direction throughout the AT program activities, including the Advisory Committee and the Alternative Financing Program
